

2015-2016 TRANSFER ADMISSION GUARANTEE (TAG) WITH SBCC

The Antioch University Santa Barbara (AUSB) Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) agreement with Santa Barbara City College (SBCC) provides an opportunity for guaranteed admission to any AUSB Concentration of your choice, provided you satisfactorily complete all the requirements listed below and any additional criteria required for admission that are in effect at the time you sign this agreement. The Transfer Admission Guarantee is currently available to any undergraduate student transferring from Santa Barbara City College. AUSB admits students fall, winter, spring, and summer quarters and the TAG is honored each quarter.

Program Requirements

All requirements must be met by the end of the term prior to the quarter of admission.

- Complete a minimum of 28 transferable semester units (maximum is 80)
- Complete the AUSB Breadth Requirement (28 semester units) or a fully certified General Education package (CSU GE or IGETC), with a grade of “C” or higher in English Composition (ENG 110)
- Earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 in all transferable lower-division coursework (note: students with less than a 2.75 GPA are encourage to apply through the regular admissions process)
- International students must also demonstrate English language proficiency through successful completion of the TOEFL, CELSA, IELTS, or Kaplan’s TOEFL. **See chart for acceptable scores.*

Deadlines and Procedures

- TAG agreements are available for all four quarters (Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer)
- You must sign and submit your TAG agreement 6 months prior to enrolling at AUSB
- The quarter of initial enrollment at AUSB is designated when the TAG Agreement is signed
- Your agreement is not valid unless signed by an AUSB Enrollment Services representative—you and your SBCC Transfer Center Director will receive a copy of the signed agreement
- All requirements for the TAG must be met no later than 15 days prior to the quarter for which you are applying for admission (i.e., by Sept. 15 for Fall, Dec. 15 for Winter, March 15 for Spring, and June 15 for Summer)
- If you miss any AUSB deadline, your agreement is automatically void

Student Responsibilities

- You are responsible for meeting all TAG requirements and notifying SBCC of any changes that may affect your TAG eligibility
- You must submit a written notification of any changes in your mailing address, email address, and phone numbers to the AUSB and your SBCC counselor
- You must submit an online application for admission to AUSB by the priority deadline for the quarter for which you are applying (see www.antiochsb.edu for dates and details)
- You are responsible for meeting all AUSB deadlines communicated to you through the AUSB Admissions Office

BA IN LIBERAL STUDIES DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015 WITH ALL NEW ADMISSIONS STARTING SUMMER 2015.

Students need 180-200 quarter units to graduate from Antioch University Santa Barbara's Bachelor of Arts Program. Students must complete a minimum of 120 quarter units in general studies (60-66%) taking courses across several disciplines. Within these 120 units, students must complete the Breadth/General Education (GE) Requirement and the Core Courses.

Breadth/GE Requirement (minimum of 42 quarter or 28 semester units):

These courses may be completed with transfer work. This requirement is automatically satisfied with completion of CSU GE Breadth Requirement or IGETC. Courses that satisfy Breadth/GE requirements may also count as units for Core Course and also Concentration requirements – please consult an Academic Advisor when making selections.

1. Oral & Written Communication (9 quarter or 6 semester units with at least one course in English Composition with a grade of "C" or better)
Oral and written communication is the academic discipline that furthers the development and expression of ideas in the written form and verbal form.
2. Arts & Humanities (9 quarter or 6 semester units: 1 course from each area)
The *arts* are the academic disciplines that explore and represent human thought and behavior in creative works. Creating works of art is a way of both coming to understand and expressing ideas and feelings. Subject areas include: Studio Art, Dramatic Art, Film Studies, Dance, Music.
The *humanities* are the academic disciplines that study human thought and experience through the written record of what people have thought, felt, or experienced in a variety of cultures. Subject areas include: Languages, Literature, Philosophy, History, Religion.
3. Physical & Biological Sciences (9 quarter or 6 semester units)
The *physical and biological sciences* are the academic disciplines that study the physical world, its inhabitants, and the symbolic relationships within. Subject areas include: Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Studies/Ecology, Geology, Physics.
4. Social Sciences (9 quarter or 6 semester units)
The *social sciences* are the academic disciplines that study human beings and their behavior from a variety of perspectives including as individuals (psychology); within social groups (sociology, communication, ethnic studies); within cultures (anthropology, global studies); within social structures (education, business); within political entities (political science, government).
5. Quantitative Reasoning (6 quarter or 4 semester units)
Quantitative studies are the academic disciplines that create systems for describing the physical world or human behavior in abstract or mathematical terms. Subject areas include: Accounting, Economics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Statistics. Note: all students must complete at least 3 quarter units in statistics as part of AUSB's degree requirements; this can be completed with transfer work or while enrolled at AUSB.

Upper-Division Requirement: Minimum of 60 upper-division quarter units must be completed. **Residency Requirement:** Minimum of 60 quarter units must be completed at AUSB.

There are seven BA Required Core Courses that all students must take at AUSB (18-21 quarter units not accepted as transfer work with exception of statistics):

Concentrations:

Students may choose to go deeper in an area of study by completing a Concentration. Options are: Applied Psychology, Business & Entrepreneurship, Child Development & Education, Communication & Media, Environmental Studies, Liberal Arts, and Marketing.

- Minimum of 30 quarter units in the chosen area of Concentration
- Maximum of 60 quarter units in the chosen area of Concentration
- At least 24 quarter units must be upper-division taken at AUSB in the chosen area of Concentration
