Our progressive programs offer a unique and responsive education, where the learner actively constructs the knowledge, skills, and dispositions to take a leadership role in our schools and community.

MASTERS DEGREE + CREDENTIALS

MASTER OF EDUCATION (MED)
with Multiple Subject Credential
Summer start | 90 units | 5 quarters

A program that meets state requirements for the Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential, while allowing students to explore their emerging academic/professional interests through an action-research inquiry project.

MASTER OF ARTS IN EDUCATION (MA)
Concentration in Social Justice &
Educational Leadership
Fall start | 45 units | 5 quarters

A program designed to give students a critical understanding of organizations – including schools. Students learn to navigate organizational systems with critical perspective and develop skills to facilitate positive change. Guided by their interests, students complete a thesis project.

MASTER OF ARTS IN EDUCATION (MA)
with Mild-to-Moderate Credential
Fall start | 51 units | 4 quarters

A program designed for experienced educators that weaves the requirements for the Preliminary Education Specialist Instruction for Mild-to-Moderate Disabilities Credential with coursework leading toward a MA in Education. A thesis project is required.

MASTER OF ARTS IN EDUCATION (MA)
with Dual Credentials
Summer start | 115 units | 8 quarters

A program that meets state requirements for two preliminary credentials: Multiple Subject and Education Specialist Instruction for Mild-to-Moderate Disabilities. The required thesis project provides students with additional expertise on a chosen topic.

STAND-ALONE CREDENTIALS

PRELIMINARY MILD-TO-MODERATE EDUCATION SPECIALIST CREDENTIAL
Fall start | 32 units | 3 quarters

A unique and efficient program for experienced educators to add the Preliminary Education Specialist Instruction for Mild-to-Moderate Disabilities Credential to their existing teaching qualifications.

CLEAR CREDENTIAL CERTIFICATE
Fall start | 9 units | 3 quarters

An alternative to induction for teachers who are eligible for induction, but for whom a state approved induction program is not available.

PRELIMINARY MULTIPLE SUBJECT CREDENTIAL
Summer start | 72 units | 4 quarters

A program that meets state requirements for the Preliminary Multiple Subject Credential.



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

All of AUSB's Credential Programs are approved by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC).

All programs within the Graduate Education & Teacher Credentialing Department:

- Provide a constructivist, reflective education focusing on both theory and practice
- Follow a cohort model with class meetings held evenings and occasional Saturdays
- Offer a small, experiential, discussion-oriented learning environment
- Encourage students to develop an active voice in education reform

EARLY DECIDER PROGRAM

TYPES OF CREDENTIALS

Multiple Subject

This credential authorizes teaching in a self-contained K-12 classroom. Self-contained classrooms are usually found at the elementary level. The credential also authorizes teaching in a core or team teaching setting.

Education Specialist Instruction: Mild-to-Moderate Disabilities

This credential applies to grades K-12 and specialized classes that instruct adults through age 22. This credential authorizes a professional to service those with any identified mild/moderate disabilities.

REAL-TIME, APPLIED LEARNING

Fieldwork practicum is a critical component of the program. As soon as schools are in session, you are in the classroom!

Student-teaching sites are located throughout the greater Santa Barbara area, and include:

- Public Schools
- Dual-Immersion Schools
- Public Progressive Schools
