2.1 Fall Enrollment Data

DEFINITIONS

FALL TERM: All students who were enrolled during the fall semester or quarter. This includes terms that span two seasons, summer/fall and fall/winter.

HEADCOUNT: Students who are actively working on a degree, certificate or external credential in a program. Headcount is unduplicated by campus. If a student was enrolled at more than one campus in the same academic year, they are counted under both locations. Headcount is also unduplicated by academic level. If a student was enrolled as both an undergraduate and a graduate student in the same academic year, they are counted under both levels.

TERM FTE (full-time equivalent): Undergraduate students are considered Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) if they had 12 or more quarter/semester hours in the term; similarly, graduate students were considered full-time if they attempted 6 or more credit hours. FTE was calculated by dividing the total number of credit hours by 12 (UG) or 6 (GR), following the calculations discussed in the paper “2015-05-20 Rationale and Methodology for Antioch FTE Calculations”. Therefore it is possible for a student to represent more than 1 FTE.

UNIVERSITY TOTAL: Headcount is unduplicated, this is not a sum of the campuses, but rather a true unduplicated headcount of students.

CAMPUS TOTAL: Headcount is unduplicated, this is not a sum of the academic levels within a campus, but rather a true unduplicated headcount of students.

5 Student Achievement Data

Retention and graduation data only include degree programs, non-degree programs are not included. Data are based on headcounts, whether the student is full-time or part-time is not taken into account. This is because many students may shift between full-time to part-time during their academic career.

Retention and graduation data are currently based on an "annual" definition. If a student enrolled for at least one term in the following academic year, that student is counted as retained. Graduation rates are based on last academic year enrolled, which may be different from academic year conferred.

6 Faculty and Staff
